The Brunel Museum is seeking a freelance filmmaker with experience of facilitation and working with young people to support a co-produced film for the museum's new permanent displays.

Timescale

- 2 days of planning in December2024/ Jan 2025
- 6 days of delivery from January-March 2025. (Sessions roughly every 2 weeks in term time on days and times TBC)

Budget

£2800 to cover all freelancer time and expenses.

Closing Date: Monday 2nd December.

Brief

The Brunel Museum are co-producing a film with young people that will be shown in the museum's new permanent displays. The film will explore the experiences of women working in STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) through interviews.

Up to 6 participants aged 16+ are being recruited through Southwark college to lead on the project. The young people will have some filmmaking experience and access to film making and editing equipment through the college. They are taking part in the project as part of their work experience for their media course.

The filmmaker/facilitator will support the young participants at all stages of the project, from scriptwriting to filming, production and editing.

- Have substantial experience of filmmaking with young people
- Have a strong understanding of the principles of co-production and youth-led projects
- Have experience in and understanding of filmmaking processes: from scriptwriting, project management, production, filming and editing.
- Have strong facilitation skills and be confident working with young people with different needs, ages and abilities
- Have experience producing films to a brief for heritage/cultural organisations or similar
